NEWS OF THE RENTAL BUILDINGS. Our renters are still behind in rent payments but have paid some. Fred Schneider, in the 2425 building, paid \$900 Wednesday and still owes \$4,043.40. He plans to be caught up by October 5. Lesley Smith, the owner of the daycare in 2435, paid \$3,000 on September 15 and still owes \$5,560. We have a contract with her that she will vacate the building on October 15 and give us all of her furnishings but have promised that she can stay if she pays \$3,000 by that date. We hope they are both able to be successful and catch up on their obligations to us. However, we have considered selling one or both of the buildings. We are canceling the special congregational business meeting because the renters are currently paying but we will vote at the regular business meeting on October 14 on whether to give permission to the Executive Council to sell at least one of the buildings if it becomes necessary. Harry Robbins suggests an asking price \$299,900 for 2425 Fruitville and \$425,000 for 2435. Our mortgage is about \$550,000 so we should have over \$100,000 in equity in the buildings.
